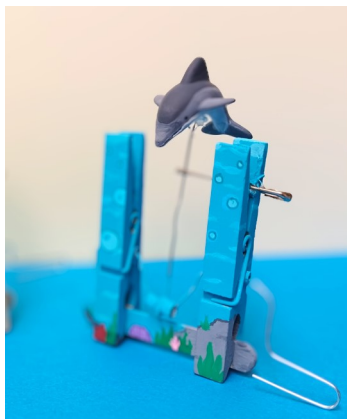


Heroes Regional Park Library

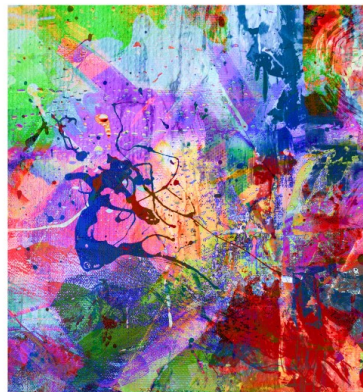

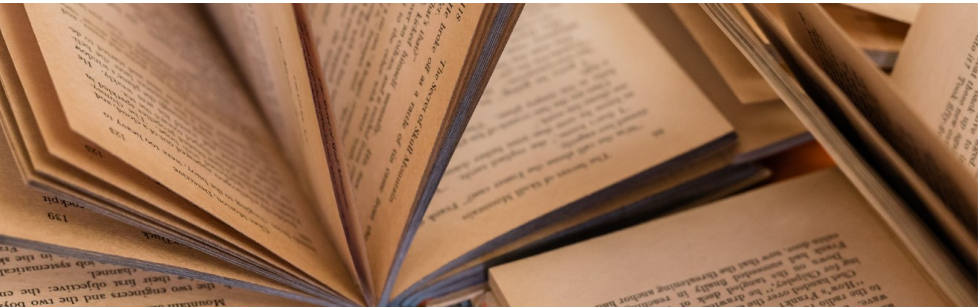
Full Steam Ahead

The Glendale Public Library has been awarded the **Full STEAM Ahead @ GPL** LSTA Grant that will fund STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Mathematics) learning opportunities for community members of all ages across all four Glendale Public Library locations. The library is committed to providing innovative and engaging programming that promotes lifelong learning for the community. With this project, the library will offer increased access to hands-on learning of STEAM subjects that will give the community an opportunity to explore ideas, collaborate, and expand critical thinking skills, while fostering a deeper understanding of STEAM subjects.
